Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel touches on the word LOVE. This word is one of depth, of relationship, and of great importance in life. St. John tells us that God is love (1 John 4:16), a love that is creative and self-giving, that desires the best for each one as God's creations.

Thus, we are all called to love God, to love each other and to love ourselves as we are given life by God. We pray for a deeper appreciation of love, for the freedom to accept it more fully and to live it as Jesus did in a self-giving way. Loving means sharing with the loved one and is shown in action. Words can be hollow unless they are incarnated in life, just as the love of the Father is incarnated in Jesus: *For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whosoever believe in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life* (John 3:16). Let us always remember that love is often a decision and we want to respond like Jesus, though sometimes, we may not feel like it. Let us continue to seek God's intercession to receive from Him always a loving heart that reaches out to others and in the end, brings them closer to Him- our Father, our Creator, our Good Shepherd.

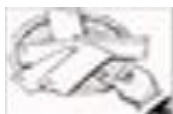

All Hallows' Day, the Solemnity of All Saints, or All Saints' Day is a celebration of all Catholic saints held on November 1 each year. "On this solemnity, we recall the holy men and women who, having completed their earthly journeys, now live forever with God. These saints, though not canonized, offer us models of abiding faith and love of God and neighbor" (Essential Guide to Seasons and Saints, 109).

In the Catholic Church, we are called to imitate and venerate saints because of their heroically virtuous lives, martyrdom, or their offering of life for others. But, what does veneration mean and why do we pray to the saints?

Veneration of the saints fosters our faith in God and does not detract from it. Rather, our faith in God is strengthened by our relationship with our brothers and sisters in the faith who are in heaven. The Church teaches that by imitating the virtues lived by the saints, the saints brings us closer to Christ. When we ask the saints to pray for us, we ask them to join their wills with the will of God and intercede for us here on earth. This is the Communion of Saints which we profess every Sunday in the Creed.

Minimum qualifications:
