Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel highlights the contrast between God's ways and human ways. The Pharisees ask Jesus about divorce. Divorce is one of the most painful types of separation that can occur between two persons and affects not only the couple but also their children, relatives and friends.

God's relationship with each one of us, in contrast, is one of never-ending, complete faithfulness, revealed in the total self-giving through the Cross. God remains faithful even when we are unfaithful. His relationship with us is like an ideal marriage: He seeks to withdraw us into a union with Himself so close that we "are no longer two, but one flesh." This love between God and an individual person overflows into the lives of others, inviting them into communion of love, echoing Jesus's words: "Let the little children come to me; do not stop them."

This message is not meant to be a painful reminder of the effects of divorce which can wound so deeply; rather, it invites all of us to ponder the absolute faithfulness of God's love for each of us, a love so powerful that it brims over and touches others. Attending Mass at St. Emile Parish

Provincial Covid Restriction Order on Religious services or faith-based gathering allows for 50 percent of normal capacity or 150 people whichever is greater. **Face masks are to be worn at all times in indoor public settings except for those who cannot put a face mask on or take it off unaided, children under five, and those who are having immediate breathing difficulties.** At all times, a physical distance of two meters is recommended in indoor public spaces.

- Mass attendance will be on a first come first serve basis.
- Maximum capacity for Masses is determined by the ability to maintain social distancing between households and availability of live streaming in the chapel.
- When capacity is reached, a sign will be placed outside the doors and the doors will be locked.
- Please continue to do self-screening the day you plan to attend mass and stay at home when indicated.
- The province still requires that everyone attending Mass provide contact tracing information by signing in at all weekday and Sunday Masses.
- It is still necessary to maintain a distance of at least six feet or two metres from those who are not members of your own household.

Weekday and the Saturday anticipated Sunday Mass will be live streamed for those who cannot attend in person. Please check the parish web site at st-emile.org for the most up-to-date information available.

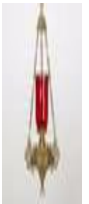

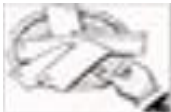

- That others may be preferred to me in everything, Jesus, grant me the grace to desire it.*

There is much more to this prayer that was penned for a holy Pope. Look it up and make room for it in your heart. I'll work on it too.

**RESPECT LIFE MONTH 2021 | REFLECTION
St. Joseph: Faithful Protector of Mother and Child**

The infant Christ “came into our world in a state of great vulnerability. He needed to be defended, protected, cared for and raised by Joseph” (PC 5). The humble and often hidden carpenter of Nazareth accompanied Mary in her pregnancy, assisted at the birth of the Messiah in a stable, presented Jesus in the Temple, fled with his family far from their homeland to protect them, and lovingly raised Jesus as his own son in the years to come.

While the angel of the Lord appeared to Mary to announce that she would bring forth the Savior of the world, it was revealed to Joseph in a series of dreams how God’s plans would be brought to fulfillment. As Pope Francis highlights, “God trusted Joseph, as did Mary, who found in him someone who would not only save her life, but would always provide for her and her child” (PC 5).

Like every other human family, the Holy Family had to confront real and concrete challenges. Yet, “in every situation, Joseph declared his own ‘fiat’” (PC 3). His “yes” to the Lord meant that regardless of the hardship and personal sacrifice to himself, he consistently chose to put the needs of Mary and Jesus before his own. Joseph’s devotion helps reveal to us our own call to show special care for the lives of those whom God has entrusted to us.

During this Year of St. Joseph, each of us can find in him “an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble” (PC, Intro). Joseph shows us how to say “yes” to life, despite our own fears, frailties, and weaknesses. For it is Joseph who was “chosen by God to guide the beginnings of the history of redemption. He was the true ‘miracle’ by which God saves the child and his mother” (PC 5).

May we, too, be miracles in the lives of those who are most in need, especially at the beginning and end of life. *Dear St. Joseph, you who were “able to turn a problem into a possibility by trusting always in divine providence” (PC 5), help us to imitate your faithful trust and courage.*
