Twenty -fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time



The family in today's Gospel story experienced suffering and brokenness: the loss of one child, the resentment of another, the broken hearts of the father and – though she is unmentioned - most certainly the mother too. Globally, this day calls to mind 9/11 and the enduring memory of the lives lost to their dear ones and the loss of hopes. Recently, the mounting urgency of climate change, phenomenon of vast hordes of migrants fleeing war, oppression or starvation in their homelands. There's also fear and disruption of a global pandemic, and the resulting economic and social upheaval starkly exposed long-standing systemic issues of racism and injustice.

Dealing with these pains are somehow pointed out in our parable today. The father, his eyes on the distant horizon, had clearly never given up hope that his son would one day return. Humbled and contrite, the boy is welcomed home with open heart, compassion and forgiveness. On the other hand, the older son's resentment is met not with impatience or anger, but with a response that is calm, reasonable and loving.

There are no simple answers to the complex problems we are all facing. The ways we can begin are: have a humble heart, a forgiving spirit, compassion, generosity, hope and above all LOVE which originates from our Heavenly Father. Let us ask God to allow us to glimpse and celebrate the good in the hearts of those around us. (Source: Living with Christ, September 2022, p. 73.)

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross: September 14

This liturgical feast has been celebrated since early times. In the 4th century, two churches in Jerusalem were dedicated to the cross on this day and the occasion was commemorated annually. Adopted by the Church in Rome during the 7th century, the feast commemorates both the dedication of the original church of the Holy Sepulchre in 335 and Christ’s victory over death.

Our Lady of Sorrows: September 15

Formerly known as the “Seven Sorrows of Mary”, this feast was instituted in 1668 by the Servite Friars. In 1814, Pius VII extended the feast to the whole Western Church in commemoration of the sufferings he had endured during his captivity in France. The seven sorrows are: *Simeon’s prophecy at the presentation of Jesus in the temple, the flight into Egypt, the disappearance of the boy Jesus in Jerusalem, the road to Calvary, the crucifixion, the removal from the cross and the entombment.*
